Overview of Jesus' Ministry (as seeing from the Gospel of John)

- Start of Jesus' Ministry (1:19-51) Forerunning of ministry John, the Baptist; Recruiting of disciples
- Public Ministry of Jesus (2: 12:) Miracles and instructions: started with changing water into wine
- Week of Passion (Week of Holy耶穌受難週) (13: 19:) Jesus' preparation of His disciples
- Resurrection of Jesus (20:1-29)

Overview of John Chapter 12

- From "passing over" (when I see the blood, I will pass over you*) to the Father's command (following His words and obeying His order); the latter leads to *eternal life*.
- Deuteronomy 32:47 They are not just idle words for you—they are your life. By them you will live long in the land you are crossing the Jordan to possess."



* No destructive plague will touch you when I strike Egypt – Passing over the forces of destruction vs. the Lord "hit forcefully the land of Egypt" on the eve of the Exodus.

 When the LORD goes through the land to strike down the Egyptians, he will see the blood on the top and sides of the doorframe and will pass over that doorway, and he will not permit the destroyer to enter your houses and strike you down. (Exodus 12:23)

The anointing (12:1-8) – Jesus anointed at Bethany

- The anointing by Mary's pouring of the expensive and pure nard expressed her love and thanks to Jesus for Himself and for His restoring Lazarus to life.
- Recall that the purpose of God's creation is love to love, to be loved, and to love one another mutually.
- The anointing was in anticipation of His burial living by God's Word, Jesus knew that as the suffering Servant, He must endure pain, die, and be buried – indicating that Jesus upcoming death on the cross was to show His sacrificial love for human.

 Mary caught the opportunity to show her love to Jesus on earth, and the opportunity was limited. "You will not always have Me," that is, here on earth. The anointing and the subsequent going to the cross demonstrated the mutual love between Mary and Jesus – fulfilling God's purpose of creation.

The triumphal entry (12:9-19) – Jesus came to Jerusalem as King

- From all over the country, people came to the Passover feast. Many sought out Jesus and also Lazarus, because Lazarus had been restored; as a result, many Jews believed in Jesus.
- So, the chief priest planned to kill two men Jesus and Lazarus!
- What a contrast Jesus brought life while the chief priest was trying to impose deaths.

- Waving their palm branches, symbols of victory, the people were shouting Hosanna – meaning "Please save" or "Save now," as described in Psalm 118:25 – LORD, save us! LORD, grant us success!
- Quoting Psalm 118:26 (Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD. From the house of the LORD we bless you.), they ascribed messianic titles to Him: He who comes the King of Israel.

- "I believe that you are the Messiah [a leader who has the power to solve the world's problems], the Son of God, who is to come into the world," said Martha (John 11:27)
- Jesus stated in Matthew 28:18, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me." All authority → Omnipotent
- Jesus' riding into the city on a young donkey was a sign of peace.

The Greeks at the Feast (Jesus Predicted His Death) (12:20-36)

- The Greeks were wanderers of the ancient world and the seekers of the truth.
- Their coming was symbolic of the coming of **Gentiles** to worship God through Christ.

The Greeks – Seekers of the Truth

- Acts 17: 22-23 ²² Paul then stood up in the meeting of the Areopagus and said: "People of Athens! I see that in every way you are very religious.
- ²³ For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: TO AN UNKNOWN GOD.
- So you are ignorant of the very thing you worship—and this is what I am going to proclaim to you.

Ask; Seek; Knock

- Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. (Matthew 7:7)
- Revelation 3:20 Here I am! *I* stand at the door and *knock*. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me. → May God come into my life come into my heart
- <u>啟 3:20</u> 看哪,我站在門外叩門,若有聽見我聲音就開門的,我要進到他那 裏去,我與他,他與我一同坐席。

The Law of Sacrifice

- The law of sacrifice Jesus gave up (His divine rights and His life) to go up (to become ruler of the universe) permanently. – death is necessary for a harvest.
- For Jesus, death was His means of entry into glory. Jesus willingness to die for others' sins in obedience to the Father brought Him glory death is necessary for a harvest by having a kernel of wheat <u>"dying"</u> in the ground and producing many seeds.

- Jesus came to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.
- To "hate his Life" means to be so committed to Christ that he has no self-centeredness, no concern for himself.

- On the other hand, the man who loves his life will lose it.
- Anything in life can become an idol including goals, interests, and loves (*noting the priorities*). A believer should undergo a spiritual death to self.
- Idol (偶像,明星): someone [or something] that is admired and respected very much [to the degree of replacing Jesus Christ]

Being a servant of Jesus requires following Him. His true disciples (those who serve Him) follow Him in humiliation and later in honor or glory.

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- **Disciple**: a person who **believes** in the ideas and principles of someone famous and **lives** the way that person does or did

- ²⁷"Now my soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour.²⁸ Father, glorify your name!"
- Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and will glorify it again." Jesus willingly expressed His submission to the will of the Father in the words, "Father, glory your name!" So also believers in difficulty should stand and embrace His will – in spite of conflicting emotions.
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- The Father then spoke from heaven **confirming His working in Jesus both in the past and in the future**.

"The prince of this world (i.e., Satan) will be driven out" means that Satan's power over people by sin and death was defeated and people can now be delivered out of Satan's domain of spiritual darkness and slavery to sin.

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- sin and death → spiritual darkness and slavery to sin
 vs. holiness and life → spiritual love/light and obedience to God

- ³⁵Then Jesus told them, "You are going to have the light just a little while longer. Walk while you have the light, before darkness overtakes you.
 Whoever walks in the dark does not know where they are going.
- He is the Light for the world, but the day of His public ministry was almost over. The darkness of night is coming in which evil powers would hold sway (i.e., control) over people.
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- The man who walks in the dark means an unbeliever who stumbles through life without knowing what life is all about. Believing in Jesus is to trust in the Light (i.e., Jesus) and become sons of Light (i.e., His disciples).

Belief and Unbelief Among the Jews (12:37-50)

- ⁴⁴Then Jesus cried out [indicating the importance of the issues to the Jews], "Whoever believes in me does not believe in me only, but in the one who sent me.⁴⁵ The one who looks at me is seeing the one who sent me.
- Jesus is the perfect manifestation of God, the One who sent Him, so that to believe in Jesus is to believe in God – when one sees Jesus, he sees the Father who sent Him.

• :46-47 I have come into the world as a light, so that no one who believes in me should stay in darkness.

 Jesus came to save the world by leading people out of Satan's kingdom of darkness into God's kingdom of love and light.

- Deuteronomy 32: 45-46 When Moses finished reciting all these words to all Israel, he said to them, "Take to heart all the words I have solemnly declared to you this day, so that you may command your children to obey carefully all the words of this law.
- Unfortunately!!
- Deuteronomy 31:29 For I know that after my death you are sure to become utterly corrupt and to turn from the way I have commanded you. In days to come, disaster will fall on you because you will do evil in the sight of the LORD and stir his anger by what your hands have made."

- The purpose of God's revelation in Jesus is *positive*: He came to save, not to judge. But rejection of God's Revelation inevitably brings a hardening in sin and *ultimately* God's judgment.
- In speaking of Jewish national unbelief John balanced his theological explanation with Jesus' serious persuasion to the nation to repent. In the words of Moses, these "are not just words for you – they are your life" (Deut. 32:47)
- Deuteronomy 32:47 They are not just idle words for you—they are your life. By them, you will live long in the land you are crossing the Jordan to possess."

:49-50 For I did not speak on my own, but the Father who sent me commanded me to say all that I have spoken.⁵⁰ I know that his command (following His order to be under His control) leads to eternal life.

So whatever I say is just what the Father has told me to say.
 → trust and obey

- Mark 9:47 And if your eye causes you to stumble, pluck it out. It is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell.
- Revelation 20:15 Anyone whose name was not found written in the book of life was thrown into the lake of fire.

In Reflection

- Passed over the forces of destruction due to being saved by the blood
- The law of sacrifice Jesus gave up (His divine rights and His life) to go up (to become ruler of the universe) permanently. – death is necessary for a harvest
- Satan's power vs. Jesus power → sin and death vs. holiness and life
- Satan's kingdom (Darkness) vs. God's kingdom (Light) → spiritual darkness and slavery to sin vs. spiritual love/light and obedience to God. Note: All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Jesus.
- Lake of fire vs. eternal life → hell vs. being able to be with the Lord





• What is the law of sacrifice for a Jesus' *disciple – his* sacrifice and *his* result?

- Athletes who hope to be competitive must *exercise great control* over themselves "in all things." This would include not just physical training, but also strict diets, sleep schedules, abstaining from harmful drugs, and caution in their behavior.
- Christians, though, exercise self-control and self-denial in order to win a crown (e.g. a gold medal for an athlete) that will never die.
- The emphasis here is on commitment and effort, not rivalry
- Paul is describing *a reward for service to Christ that will be given* in addition to salvation.
